

## Enrollees' and Surrogates' attitudes toward enrollment & awareness survey

- Was incorporated into the ESETT Protocol
  - To capture quantitatively meaningful data on the views of all enrolled subjects within an EFIC study.
- Created in collaboration with the HSP-WG to be:
  - Brief
  - Easily administered verbally or in paper and pencil form
  - Completed following a consent decision to continue participation in ESETT
  - Including by subjects who refuse ongoing participation in ESETT
- It should be submitted for IRB approval along with consent docs.

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### Attitudes toward enrollment & awareness survey – cont.

### Who Should Complete the Survey:

- Adult enrollment
  - Subjects should be approached to complete the survey if capable
  - An LAR can complete the survey as well
- Peds enrollment
  - An LAR or Surrogate survey is all that is required
  - If a Peds subject would like complete the survey they may, but it is not required
- Spanish translation
  - Sites that have consents forms for ESETT translated into Spanish should also have IRB approval to use the attitudes surveys available in Spanish



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
